Subject:Environmental Clearance for construction of "City Emporia Mail" at Plot No 143 A, Industrial Area, Phase-I, Chandigarh.

Dear Sirs.

I am directed to refer to your application seeking prior environmental clearance for the above project under the EIA Notification 2006. The above proposal has been appraised as per prescribed procedure on the basis of the documents enclosed with the application viz. Form1, Form 1A, Conceptual Plan and the additional clarifications furnished in response to the observations of the Expert Appraisal Committee (EAC) constituted by the competent authority in its 33rd and 34th meetings held on 12th September and 12th December 2008 respectively.

- 2. The project proponent is proposing to construct commercial complex at Plot No 143 A, Industrial Area, Phase-I, Chandigarh at a cost of Rs. 67.95 crore. The project will comprise construction of restaurant, administrative area and Commercial area in the building having ground plus five floors and two basements with maximum height of 29.91 m. Total plot area is 8,103.83 sq.m. The total built up area as indicated is 24,744.58 sq.m. Total water requirement will be 139 KLD including recycled water and 76 KLD of waste water will be generated. The STP will be installed for the treatment of sewage generated from the complex (capacity-100 KLD). The treated waste water will be used for flushing, cooling and horticulture purpose. The solid waste generated (300kg/d) will be segregated into organic and inorganic waste. The recyclable solid waste will be handed over to authorized vendors for recovery of recyclable material and organic biodegradable waste will be sent to solid waste collection bins provided by the Municipal authority. The parking space proposed for parking of cars is 366 ECS.
- 3. The EAC after due consideration of the relevant documents submitted by the project proponent and additional clarifications furnished in response to its observations have recommended the grant of environmental clearance for the project mentioned above subject to compliance with the EMP and other stipulated conditions. Accordingly, the Ministry hereby accords necessary

environmental clearance for the project under category 8 (a) of Ela environmental clearance for the strict compliance with the specific Ela environmental clearance for the project union category 8 (a) of ElA Notification 2006 subject to the strict compliance with the specific and conditions mentioned below: general conditions mentioned below: PART A- SPECIFIC CONDITIONS

I. Construction Phase

Vehicles hired for construction activities should be operated only

during non-peak hours.

All the top soil excavated during construction activities should be in horticulture/landscape developments used. All the top soil excavated during the stored for use in horticulture/landscape developments within the ii.

Ready mixed concrete shall be used in building construction.

Ready mixed construction shall be reduced by use of pre iii. mixed concrete, curing agents and other best practices. iv.

Fixtures for showers, toilet, flushing and drinking should be of low vi. flow either by use of aerators or pressure reducing devices or sensor based control.

Use of glass may be reduced upto 40% to reduce the electricity vii. consumption and load on air conditioning. If necessary, use high quality double glass with special reflective coating in windows.

Roof should meet the prescriptive requirement as per energy viii. conservation building code by using appropriate thermal insulation material to fulfill requirement.

Opaque wall should meet prescriptive requirement as per energy ix. conservation building code which is proposed to be mandatory for all air conditioned spaces while it is aspirational for non air conditioned spaces by use of appropriate thermal insulation to fulfill requirement.

Storm water control and its reuse should be as per Central Ground X. Water Board and BIS standards for various applications.

All required sanitary and hygienic measures including portable XÍ. toilets/septic tank etc. for labour should be in place before starting construction activities and to be maintained throughout the construction phase.

XII. Soil and ground water samples will be tested to ascertain that there is no threat to groundwater quality by leaching of heavy metals and other toxic contaminants.

Xiii. A First Aid Room will be provided at the project site both during construction and operation of the project. XIV.

Adequate drinking water facility should construction workers at the site. The safe disposal of wastewater and solid wastes generated during the construction phase should XV.

Disposal of muck including excavated material during construction phase should not create any adverse effects on the neighboring communities and be disposed off taking the necessary precautions for general safety and health aspects of people.

Diesel power generating sets used during construction phase should be of "enclosed type" to prevent noise and should conform to rules made under Environment (Protection) Act 1986, prescribed for air and noise emission standards.

Ambient noise levels should conform to standards both during day and night when measured at boundary wall of the premises. Incremental pollution loads on the ambient air and noise quality

should be closely monitored during construction phase.

The construction agencies shall use flyash based material/ products as per the provisions of fly ash notification of 14.9.1999 and as amended on 27.8.2003.

Vehicles hired for bringing construction material at site should be in good condition and should have valid "pollution under check" (PUC) certificate and to conform to applicable air and noise emission standards and should be operated only during non-peaking hours.

Construction spoils including bituminous material and other hazardous materials must not be allowed to contaminate water courses and the dump sites for such material must be secured so

that they should not leach into the ground water.

Any hazardous waste generated during construction phase should be disposed of as per applicable Rules & norms with necessary approvals of the Pollution Control Committee.

xxii. Under the provisions of the Environment (Protection) Act 1986, legal action shall be initiated against the project proponent if it was found that construction of the project had started without obtaining environmental clearance.

xxiii. The diesel required for operating DG Set shall be stored in underground tanks and if required, clearance from the Chief

Controller of Explosives shall be taken.

structural safety of the buildings due to earthquake, adequacy of fire fighting equipments etc. as per National Building Code including protection measures from lightening etc. If any forest land is involved in the proposed site, clearance under The Forest Conservation Act shall be taken from the competent Authority.

xxv. Regular supervision of the above and other measures for monitoring should be in place all through the construction phase

so as to avoid disturbance to the surroundings.

II. Operation Phase

The environmental clearance recommended to the project is subject to the specific conditions as follows:

Diesel power generating sets proposed as source of back up power for lifts, common area illumination and for domestic use should be of "enclosed type" and conform to rules made under The Environment (Protection) Act 1986. The location of DG Sets may be decided in consultation with Pollution Control Committee.

ii. Ambient noise levels should be controlled to ensure that it does not exceed the prescribed standards both within and at the

boundary of the proposed complex.

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Week holes in the compound walls shall be provided to the catchment area during the distinction of the catchment area during the catchment area. The STP shall be installed for the treatment of sewage generaled monacon period.

The open spaces inside the plot should be preferably landscaped İX. and covered with vegetation of indigenous variety. Green belt of adequate width and density will be provided all around the periphery of the plot suitably with local species to reduce noise and dust level.

The ground water levels and its quality should be monitored regularly in consultation with Central Ground Water Authority.

A Report on the energy conservation measures should be Xi. prepared incorporating details about building technology, R & U Factors etc and submitted to the Ministry in three months time

XII. The values of R & U for the building envelope should meet the requirements of the hot & humid climatic location. Details of the building envelope should be worked out and furnished in three months time.

Xiii. Energy conservation measures like installation of CFLs/FLs for lighting the areas outside the building should be integral part of the project design and should be in place before project commissioning commissioning. Used CFLs & FLs should be properly collected and disposed. and disposed of/sent for re-cycling as per the prevailing rules/guidelines of the regulatory authority to avoide Mercury contamination. Use of solar panels may be done to the extent XİV.

The buildings should have adequate distance between them to allow movement of fresh allow movement of fresh air and passage of light to the residential

Adequate measures should be taken to prevent odour problem from solid waste processing the taken to prevent odour problem. from solid waste processing plant as also from the STP.

PART - B. GENERAL CONDITIONS

The environmental safeguards contained in the documents should i) be implemented in letter and spirit.

Provision should be made for the supply of kerosene or cooking gas and pressure cooker to the laborers during construction ii)

6 monthly monitoring reports should be submitted to the Ministry iii)

- The compliance status of stipulated conditions of this clearance shall be uploaded on the web site of the company and shall also iv) be displayed in the project premises at a prominent place especially with respect to ambient air quality data.
- Officials from the Regional Office of MOEF, Chandigarh who would be monitoring the implementation of environmental safeguards should be given full cooperation, facilities and documents / data by the project proponents during their inspection. A complete set of all the documents submitted to MoEF should be forwarded to the CCF, Regional office of MOEF, Chandigarh.
- In the case of any change(s) in the scope of the project, the project 5. would require a fresh appraisal by this Ministry.
- The Ministry reserves the right to modify/add additional environmental safeguards subsequently, if found necessary. Environment Clearance granted will be revoked if it is found that false information has been given for approval of the project.
- Necessary permission shall be obtained from the State Fire Department for providing fire safety measures before allotment of premises 7. for residential purpose in the township.
- These stipulations would be enforced among others under the 8. provisions of the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, the Air (Prevention and control of Pollution) act 1981, the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and the Public Liability (Insurance) Act, 1991.
- The project proponent shall enter in to MOU with all buyers of the property, if any, to ensure operation and maintenance of the STP and other assets.
- This environmental clearance is subject to the decision of the Hon'ble 10. Supreme court in the matter of Writ Petition (Civil) 460/2004 of Goa foundation v/s Union of India.
- Any appeal against this environmental clearance shall lie with the National Environment Appellate Authority, if preferred, within a period of 30

days as prescribed under section 11 of the National Environment Appellate Act. 1997.
